## ID Please...

Parents love taking pictures of their children; it's a universal love. But out of the thousands of snapshots, how many would be considered ID (identification) quality? What is ID quality? Furthermore, how many families actually have ID's for their child? Unfortunately, many parents do not have proper identification for their children until a terrifying situation warrants one.

Why do parents need ID for their children? The Department of Justice reports that more than 800,000 children go missing every year. This translates to one child every 40 seconds! Maintaining a child ID can help reduce this statistic by providing a tool for parents to help protect their children.

What should be included when assembling an identification kit? ID's should include a photograph of the child, the child's fingerprints and a detailed description of the child's physical characteristics. The picture should be a recent head and shoulders photo that bears a true resemblance of the child with the face clearly seen and in focus. The current trend in child IDs is digital but physical IDs are useful, too. If digital, the image size should facilitate ease of electronic transmission when needed. A detailed description of physical characteristics should include name/nickname, height, weight, sex, age/dob, eye color, hair color/style, scars, glasses and any other identifying marks. Fingerprints can be digital or physical.

Correct information is a crucial part of the ID process. Relevant information needs to be updated on a regular basis (6 months is recommended) or whenever physical changes have occurred (i.e. change in hair color/style, tooth loss, braces, etc.)

All copies, whether in digital format (CD-Rom or Flashdrive) or an actual physical ID card, should be maintained by parents or guardians ONLY and should be secure and readily accessible. The responsibility and right lies with the parents to control the dissemination of information. The main purpose is to protect children and parents/guardians need to always be cautious about keeping their family's information private and safe.

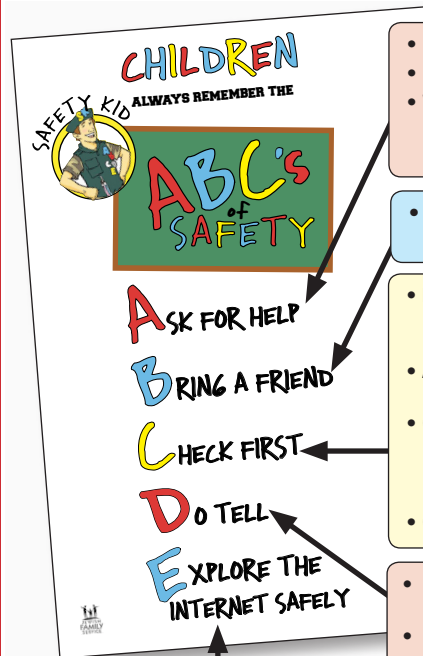

- For emergencies call **9-1-1** or **0**
- Know your address and phone number
- When separated from parents or friends, ask a **Safe Helper** for assistance, especially a mom with children

- It is always safer to go places with a Buddy

- Plan with parents when you should open the door or answer the phone ... then follow the plan
- Ask a parent or adult in charge before changing any plan
- Check First with a parent or adult in charge before going anywhere with anyone, accepting a gift or helping them out
- Communication is the key to safety

- Rule #1: Touching, talking about or seeing private parts is **Never a Game**
- Rule #2: Touching, talking about or seeing private parts is **Never a Secret**
- Rule #3: You can say **NO** whether it is to an adult, a friend, a brother or a sister
- Remember **NO - RUN - TELL** if anyone wants to take you or touch you inappropriately
- Get help from a trusted adult

- Never give out personal information
- Never agree to meet someone you don't know
